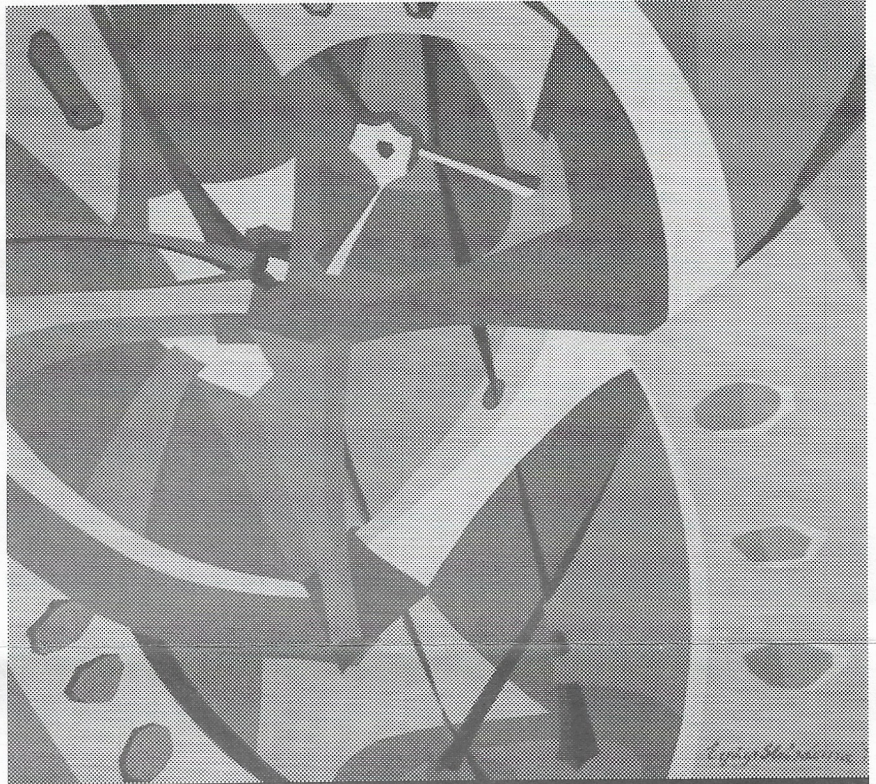


# ESPHYR SLOBODKINA: Abstractions

MARCH 3 - APRIL 12

Esphyr Slobodkina, who passed away in 2002, was born in the Siberian town of Chelyabinsk in 1908. By 1920, the advancing political unrest encroaching from western Russia on its eastern frontier forced Esphyr, her sister Tamara and their mother to flee to the city of Harbin, Manchuria, a safe haven for wealthy Russians. By 1928, having graduated from business school, Esphyr decided to join her brother Ronya who was living in New York City.

Since her early days at the National Academy of Design, her brief marriage to the artist Illya Bolotowsky, and her involvement as a founding member of the American Abstract Artist group, Esphyr Slobodkina consistently pushed the boundaries of contemporary art. This exhibition, which includes writings, paintings, sculpture, collages and illustrated children's books, many from the collection of Hillwood Art Museum, celebrates her rich legacy.
